About College of Physiotherapy

College of Physiotherapy was established as one of the constituent college of Pt. Bhagwat Dayal Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak in year 2009, with intake of 30 students in Bachelor of Physiotherapy. College of Physiotherapy provides physiotherapy services to outdoor and indoor patients in PGIMS, Rohtak.

Course run by College of Physiotherapy

<u>Master of Physiotherapy</u> – MPT course is a two years course in four specialties (i) MPT Orthopaedics, Sports, Cardiopulmonary & Neurology with an intake of 11 seats in each specialty. Regarding rule & regulation of eligibility and distribution of seats, prospectus of MPT course available on the website of University of Health Sciences, Rohtak can be consulted.

Admission Procedure: Admission to the MPT course is made on the basis of the merit of competitive entrance examination conducted by Pt B.D.S.University of Health Sciences, Rohtak. For the scheme of examination prospectus available on the website of university can be consulted. The Govt. Notification issued by Haryana Govt. from time to time will be the final guidelines for admission to MPT course for the relevant Academic Session.

Eligibility Conditions

- 1. Must have passed B.P.T. Course from any recognized College of Physiotherapy.
- 2. Must have completed 06 months internship at the time of counseling.
- 3. Candidate shall be medically fit.

<u>Bachelor of Physiotherapy</u> - BPT course is a Four & half academic years including six months compulsory rotating internship.

Admission Procedure: Admission to the BPT courses are made on the basis of the merit of competitive entrance examination conducted by Pt. B.D.S.University of Health Sciences, Rohtak. The Govt. Notification issued by Haryana Govt. from time to time will be the final guidelines for admission to BPT course for the relevant Academic Session.

Eligibility Conditions

- **A.** Educational Qualifications: For Bachelor of Physiotherapy (BPT). The candidate must have passed following examinations:
- A candidate must have passed Sr. Sec. Certificate Exam. (10+2) of Board of School Education Haryana or equivalent exam with a minimum of 50 % marks in the aggregate in the subjects of

- **B.** Age: The candidates is also required to fulfill the following minimum conditions to appear in the Entrance Examination for Govt. Institutions:-
- (i) He/She shall attain the age of 17 years or more on 31st December of the year of entrance.

Note: The age shall be determined as per entry in the Matriculation/Higher Secondary or its equivalent Certificate.

C.The Indian Citizen of following categories are eligible to appear in common entrance examination for admission to BPT:

- i) The candidates, who are bonafide residents of Haryana as per instructions issued by the Chief Secretary to Govt. Haryana Chandigarh vide letter No.62/1795-6GS1 dated 3.10.96., U.O. No. 62/27/2003 6 GSI dated 29.07.2003 and submit relevant certificate of bonafide residents as laid down in letter no.22/28/2003-3GS-III dated 30.1.2004.
- ii) The children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of the employees of Indian Defense Services/Para-Military Forces belonging to Haryana State at the time of entry into service as per their service record. (Such candidates will submit a certificate from the Officer duly authorized by the Army/Navy/Air Force/concerned Para-Military Forces Headquarters, as the case may be).
- iii) The children/wards (if parents are not living)/ dependents of Ex-employees of Indian Defense Services/Para-Military Forces belonging to Haryana State at the time of entry into service as per their service record who retired from service on or after first April of the preceding year of admission. (Such candidates will submit a certificate from the Officer duly authorized by the Army/ Navy/Air Force/concerned Para-Military Force Headquarters, as the case may be).
- iv) The children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of Ex-employees of Indian Defence Services/Para-Military Forces belonging to Haryana State at the time of entry into service as per their service record, provided the candidate has studied 10+2 as a regular candidate in a recognized institution in Haryana. (Such candidates will submit a certificate from the Officer duly authorized by the Army/Navy/Air Force/concerned Para-Military Forces Headquarters, as the case may be and also a certificate to the effect that he/she has studied 10+2 as a regular candidate in a recognized institution in Haryana from the Principal/Head of the Institution last attended in the performa

- 9. Children/Wards of Military personnel (including personnel of para-military Forces) killed in action or permanently disabled in action and boarded out from the services or Ex-servicemen and their wards will be considered for reservation as Ex-servicemen and their wards. The instruction Govt. of Haryana vide No. 22/10/2013-1GSIII dated 10.08.2017 will be followed for priorities for reservation or preference to the ward of ARMED Forces Personnel.
- 10. A candidate who applies either for reserved category or for both reserved and open categories will be considered first in open category. In case he is not selected in open category, he will be considered for reserved category. In case a candidate does not fill up his reserve category in his application form, he/she will not be subsequently considered for admission against that category.
- 11. A candidate who applies for and qualifies for admission in more than one reserved category will be asked to exercise his choice at the time of counseling. Institutional preference which the candidate exercised at the time of counseling will be considered final.
- 12. Stipend will be paid to MPT students of College of Physiotherapy PGIMS, Rohtak as per policy of Govt. of Haryana.

NOTE:- Final distribution of seats will be displayed at the time of counseling.

E. Medical Examination

- (a). The selected candidates at the time of counselling(s) reports to college for medical examination and fee deposition on the dates fixed by the Counselling Board. The standard of physical fitness required for admission is determined by the said board. The candidature of CANDIDATES found medically unfit will be liable to cancellation.
- (b). Selected physically handicapped candidates also have to appear before the Medical Board for assessment whether they are fit to carry out the duties despite being handicapped. The decision of the Board is final.

- ii) of having secured at least35% marks of the total marks fixed for internal assessment in each subject, separately in order to be eligible to appear in all University examinations.
- iii) of good moral character.

Note: 1) Internal Assessment should be submitted to the Controller of Examination at least two weeks before the commencement of theory examinations. All the college shall adopt uniform criteria for Internal Assessment for which a record of each student shall be maintained in each department, which should be made available for inspection by the student concerned as well as university authorities.

The re-apper/fail students may be reassured if they so desire, next time for the purpose of improvement of internal assessment otherwise their previous score of assessment will be carried forward.

- 2) If a candidate full fills the condition laid down in clause 5b (i) and (ii) above for one or more subject(s) he /she may be allowed to take the examination in such subject(s) in which he/she fulfills the requirements.
- (c) The First Professional B. P. T. Examination shall be in the subjects as per syllabus and candidate shall be required to pass all the subjects:-
- i) There shall be a provision of internal assessment of 10% marks in each subject of B. P. T. course in theory and practical, separately.
- ii) Each theory paper shall be of three hours duration.
- (iii) The minimum number of marks to pass the examination shall be 50% in theory including internal Assessment, and 50% in practical/clinical including Internal Assessment in each subject.
- iv) A candidate securing 75% or above marks in any of the subjects shall be declared to have passed with Distinction in that subject provided he has passed the examination in first attempt.
- v) A candidate who fails in one or more subjects in his/her 1st attempt, shall be permitted to attend classes in 2nd Prof B.P.T. course. However, he/she must pass First Prof B.P.T. examinations at least one term (6 months) before he/she is allowed to appear in the Second Prof B.P.T. examination.
- vi) A candidate who passes in one or more subjects shall be exempted from appearing in these subjects at a subsequent examination. The candidate can appear in failed subject in the subsequent examination irrespective of the number of attempts already taken. The candidate will not have to appear in subjects already passed.

4. Examinations

- 4.1 The examination shall be held twice in year, one regular in the month of April/May and the other supplementary examination in the month of September/October or on such dates as may be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor.
- 4.2 The date(s) fixed for the receipt of the admission form and fees for examinations without and with late fee, as fixed by Vice-Chancellor shall be notified by the Controller of Examination.
- 4.3 First B.P.T Examination will be held at the end of first academic year, second at the end of second academic year, third at the end of third academic year and fourth or final (B.P.T) Examination at the end of Fourth academic year.
- 4.4 A candidate who has passed the first year BPT examination of this University shall be join 2nd year BPT class. However, a candidate who has failed in one or more subjects in the first year BPT examination may be allowed to attend the next higher until he/she class appears and qualifies the 1st year BPT examination. A candidate will not be allowed to appear in 2nd year BPT Examination till he/she passes in all the subjects of 1st year BPT Examination as regular or ex-student.
- 4.5 A candidate who has passed the second year BPT examination of this University shall be eligible to join 3rd year BPT class. However, a candidate who has failed in one or more subjects in the second year BPT examination may be allowed to attend the next higher class until he/she appears and qualifies for the 2nd year BPT examination. A candidate will not be allowed to appear in 3rd year BPT Examination till he/she passes in all the subjects of 2nd year BPT Examination as regular or ex-student.
- 4.6 A candidate who has passed the Third year BPT examination of this University shall be eligible to join 4th year BPT class. However, a candidate who has failed in one or more subjects in the third year BPT examination may be allowed to attend the next higher class until he/she appears and qualifies the 3rd year BPT examination. A candidate will not be allowed to appear in 4th year BPT Examination till he/she passes in all the subjects of 3rd year BPT Examination as regular or ex-students.
- 5. First Professional B.P.T Examination:

The First Professional B.P.T Examination shall be open to a person who

- a) has been enrolled for one academic year preceding the examination in a Physiotherapy College affiliated to this University.
- b) has his/her name submitted to the Registrar by the Principal of the college with the following certificates:-

V) A candidate who passes in one or more subjects shall be exempted from appearing in these subjects at a subsequent examination. The candidate can appear in failed subject in the subsequent examination irrespective of the number of attempts already taken. The candidate will not have to appear in subjects already passed.

9. General conditions

- The examiners shall be appointed by the University on the recommendations of the Board of 9.1 Studies in Para Medical Sciences. Provided that The senior most teacher in a subject who has taught the students for at least six months shall be appointed internal examiner. No person below the rank of Reader/Assistant Professor in the subject of Degree level institution shall be appointed as an Internal Examiner. However, in compelling circumstances a Senior Lecturer/Lecturer with at least three years of teaching experience in the subject may be made an Internal Examiner.
- External Examiner shall be appointed only from the teaching staff of Physiotherapy College ii) outside the University.
- iii) The University may get each paper/ part set from External and Internal Examiners.
- The practical examination shall be conducted jointly by the internal examiner of the respective iv) institution and the external examiner for that institute.
- The award list duly signed by both the examiners would be submitted to the Controller of v) Examinations immediately after the conduct of examination. A copy of the result of practical examination would be kept by the Internal Examiner for six months for reference and record.
- In order to maintain secrecy the evaluation of answer books shall be got evaluated by putting vi) fictitious roll numbers thereon-spot evaluation (table marking) or any other method under the direction of the Vice-Chancellor.
- The Internal Assessment shall be determined by the Head of the Department concerned based 9.2 on the student's class work, homework, house examination records and participation in cocurricular activities and the same duly countersigned by the Principal shall be submitted to the Controller of Examination at least two weeks before the commencement of the examination.

10. **Declaration of Result**

The Controller of Examinations shall publish the result after the examination. The candidates shall be issued Detailed Marks Certificate through their principals. The Decree of Bachelor of Physiotherapy (B.P.T.) shall be awarded by the University on successful completion of six months compulsory rotatory internship, duly certified by the Principal of the College.

11. Migration

A student of any Physiotherapy College who has passed his First Prof. B.P.T. examination may be permitted to migrate from one College to another under the jurisdiction of Pt.B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak on the following conditions: -

- a) The student has to apply for migration to the University within two months from the declaration of his/Tier First Prof. B.P.T. result.
- b) The applicant student will be permitted to migrate if a vacant seat is available in the College where, he/she wants to migrate.
- c) The applicant's total aggregate marks should not be less than the lowest marks obtained by a student of the college to which the migration is sought. This will be applicable only to the applicants seeking inter-University migration.
- d) The applicant must submit 'No Objection Certificate' from both the Principals.
- e) Notwithstanding anything contained in the above rules, if an applicant does not fulfil any of the conditions given above, the Vice-Chancellor may allow a student to migrate under exceptional circumstances to another College.

12. Grace Marks

The grace marks up to a maximum of five marks may be awarded at the discretion of the University to a student who has failed only in one subject but has passed in all other subjects.

13. Clinical Training

All the candidates shall complete 300 teaching hours in Clinical Training during the course.

14. Compulsory Internship

14.1 All the students after passing Final Prof B.P.T. examination shall go in for six months compulsory rotatory internship in the following departments in their College/Institution:-

1) Physiotherapy Out-Patient Department	1 month
ii) Orthopedics	1 month
iii) Neurology & Neuro Surgery including ICU	1 month
iv) Cardiology& Cardiothoracic Surgery	1 month
v) General Medicine & General Surgery	1 month
vi) Community based Rehabilitation / Geriatrics	1 month

- 14.2 After completion of internship the concerned Principal will certify that the student has satisfactorily completed internship.. Thereafter the student will be awarded the degree of Bachelor of Physiotherapy (B.P.T.).
- 14.3 Under some exceptional circumstances a student may be permitted to complete his internship in another affiliated Physiotherapy College if Principals of both the colleges give their consent and the University issues No Objection Certificate to this effect. This would be allowed only if a seat is vacant in the college in which the student wants to complete his internship.

15. General
