2. ABOUT DEPARTMENT OF DERMATOLOGY, VENEREOLOGY & LEPROSY

Department of Dermatology, Venereology and Leprosy, Pt. B. D. Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak has always been committed to ensure the highest possible level of dermatological health and well-being to all the patients coming to the Department. The Department of Dermatology, Venereology and Leprosy, Pt. B,D.Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak consists of 04 Consultants (01 Senior Professor, 01 Professor, 01 Associate Professor, and 01 Assistant Professor) with 02 Senior Residents. There are 05 MD students in each year for 03 years.

The Department renders its services daily on all working days to the patients in the OPD. There is an OPD attendance of on an average of 400-500 patients per day in the OPD of the department. The Department also provides Indoor facilities and runs a Dermatology Ward where Dermatology patients requiring admission are admitted and treated. The Department also runs Special Clinics i.e., Leprosy Clinic, STD clinic and Vitiligo Clinic in which patients of Leprosy, STD and Vitiligo are evaluated, advised treatment and are regularly followed -up. Awareness generation & prevention along with counseling are given paramount importance and are provided to the patients who are affected by Leprosy, STIs, Vitiligo in these special clinics.

There are also special laboratory and Minor OT for basic laboratory tests relevant to dermatological diseases and minor Dermatological procedures. Minor OT procedures include electrocautery, radiofrequency ablation, intralesional injection, pairing of callosities etc. Skin biopsy

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diseases wherever indicated. Chemical peeling procedures such as Glycolic acid peel, Salicylic acid peel and TCA peel are also done for the treatment of various pigmentary disorders.
