

The Department of Anatomy deals with the study of Morphology of the Human body. It is well

equipped with teaching and nonteaching staff. It has illustrious museum, big dissection hall, histology

lab and a research lab.

Teaching done in Department of Anatomy:

Teaching is done for MD, MBBS, BDS, BPT/BPO, B.Sc. Nursing and Paramedical courses (B.Sc. - M.L.T.,

O.T., Optometry and Perfusion Technology).

Histology Laboratory:

The histology Laboratory is well equipped with slides Monocular & Binocular microscopes. Department

has Trinocular microscope fitted with a camera & laptop connection for projection facilities for

demonstration to students. Digiflex Gallery is also available for better understanding of histology.

Dissection Hall:

The Dissection hall is well-ventilated and adequately illuminated with natural light. It has the

accommodation capacity of 200 undergraduate students at a time. It is equipped with exhaust facilities,

formalin tanks and attached cold storage room for preserving cadavers. There is separate Bone room

with assorted columns with adequate number of bones and articulated skeletons. There is a well

equipped embalming room having all the facilities for embalming and sectioning of the bodies where PG

students are regularly trained for embalming the fresh bodies with the help of Cadaveric Injector. A

separate cadaveric infusion room is also available. In dissection hall, adequate numbers of Maceration

Tank for retrieval of bones are available.

Body Donations:

Anatomy department is well recognized center for body donation with 24 hour availability. Transport

facilities are moved to body donors from areas adjoining Rohtak. Copies of body donation forms,

certificate and ID card are attached with this document.





- (c) "near relative" means any of the following relatives of the deceased, namely, a wife, husband, parent, son, daughter, brother and sister, and includes any other person who is related to the deceased—
 - (i) by lineal or collateral consanguinity within the degrees in lineal relationship and six degrees in collateral relationship; or
 - (ii) by marriage either with the deceased or with any relative specifically mentioned in this clause or with any other relative within the aforesaid degrees.
- Explanation:— The expressions "lineal and collateral consanguinity" shall have the meanings assigned to them respectively in sections 25 and 26 of the Indian Succession Act, 1925;
- (d) "prescribed" means prescribed by rules made under this Act;
- (e) "unclaimed body" means the body of a deceased person who has no near relative or whose body has not been claimed by any of his near relatives within such period as may be prescribed.

3. If any doubt or dispute arises whether a person is a near relative of the deceased, the matter shall be referred to the authorised officer whose decision on such reference shall be final and conclusive.



(1) Where a person under treatment in a hospital, whether established by, or vesting in, or maintained by, the State Government or any local authority, dies in such hospital and his body is unclaimed, the authorities in-charge of such hospital shall with the least practicable delay report the fact to the authorised officer and such officer shall then hand over the unclaimed body to the authorities in-charge of an approved institution for any therapeutic purpose or for the purpose of conducting anatomical examination, dissection, surgical operation or research work.

- (2) Where a person dies in a hospital other than a hospital referred to in sub-section (1), on in a prison and his body is unclaimed, the authorities in charge of such hospital or prison shall with the least practicable delay report the fact to the authorised officer, and such officer shall hand over the unclaimed body to the authorities in-charge of an approved institution for any purpose specified in sub-section (1).
- (3) Where a person having no permanent place of residence in the area where his death has taken place dies in any public place in such area and his body is unclaimed, the authorised officer of that area shall take possession of the body and shall hand it over to the authorities incharge of an approved institution for any purpose specified in sub-section (1).

6. Wheever with the intention of defeating the provisions of the Penalty. Act, disposes of, or abets the disposal of, an unclaimed body save as permitted by this Act, or obstructs any authority in charge of an approved institution or an authorised officer from handing over, taking possession of, removing or using, such dead body for the purpose specified in this Act, shall, on conviction, be punishable with fine which may extend to

two hundred rupees. 7. All officers of the Departments of Police and Public Health and Duty of Police all officers in the employ of a local authority and all village officers and Panches and Sarpanches shall be bound to take all reasonable measures to assist any authority or officer authorised under this Act to obtain the possession of an unclaimed body.

- 8. No suit, prosecution or other legal proceeding shall lie against any person for anything which is in good faith done or intended to be done under this Act or the rules made thereunder.
- 9. All officers appointed under this Act shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of section 21 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

10. (1) The State Government may, by notification, make rules Power to make for carrying out the purposes of this Act.

(3) Every rule made under this section shall be laid as soon as may be after it is made before the House of the State Legislature while it is in session for a total period of ten days which may be comprised in one session or in two successive sessions, and if before the expiry of the session in which it is so laid or the session immediately following, the House agrees in making any modification in the rule or the House agrees that the rule should not be made, the rule shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be, so however that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule.

11. The Punjab Anatomy Act, 1963 (Punjab Act 14 of 1963), in its application to the State of Haryana, is hereby repealed.
